Discussion with Caroline Wallace and Drew Gilchrist from DCNR Southeast office- cover 5 county area

Increasing funding every year for trails. Fund trail feasibility studies, engineering studies, fund acquisition, easements, and train design and construction. Funding round is coming up April 2013; info comes out in November

Priority in trails – Statewide (50 miles or more); 10 mile or more trails (such as Cross County Trail), and lastly local trails (like Radnor trail)

Typical grants – 50/50 split

Brandywine Trust has been contacted. Discussion with Danella should be next on the docket.

Work on the pieces to make sure they are place before the feasibility study.

Timing – the deadline is April 2013; project needs to be ready to go. Review by fall. Will need to get an approval for an RFP.

Need support from Whitemarsh, developers, people working with the township on the project. Like to see partnerships. Traffic study could be part of feasibility study funding.

The difficulty of crossing Germantown Pike was discussed.

February 6, 2013 – meeting in Conshohocken with DCNR on how to apply for grants

William Penn Foundation – have donated much money to trails in the region
