January 10, 2022

Plymouth Township Council held its Regular Meeting at the Greater Plymouth Community Center. The following officials were in attendance:

Pledge of Allegiance - The Regular Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. and Chairman Manero led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT- There was no public comment pertaining to any items advertised on the agenda.

20 Years of Service Resolution- Kyle Wilhelm- ACTION- Ms. Bramblett read the resolution recognizing Kyle Wilhelm for his generous and outstanding service and contributions rendered while serving in the Police Department since January 7, 2002, thereby completing 20 years of service. Council extends its appreciation to Kyle Wilhelm who served with commitment and dedication. Plymouth Township Council desires to recognize the diligent and valuable service rendered by Kyle Wilhelm. Ms. Bramblett made a motion to approve the resolution and was seconded by Ms. Bandish. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

Recognition- Detective Jeffery McGee- ACTION- Mr. Manero read the recognition for Detective Jeffery McGee, detailed to the Federal Bureau of Investigation from 2015 until 2017 and assigned to the FBI Violent Crime Task Force, for the investigation and arrest of a suspect nicknamed by law enforcement as the "Straw Hat Bandit", who committed a series of eleven armed bank robberies including the Wells Fargo Bank located in Plymouth Township; and by the United States Attorney's Office for the investigation and arrest of an organized criminal gang responsible for a series of armed robberies that occurred throughout Southeastern Pennsylvania.

Now, therefore be it resolved that Detective Jeffery McGee be commended for his investigative skills and dedication that led to him being honored by the US Attorney's Office for two distinct investigations. Mr. Manero made a motion to approve this recognition and was seconded by Mr. Whitney. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

Recognition- Officer David Phillips- ACTION- Ms. Viscio read the recognition for Officer David Phillips, who was selected and recognized as the tactical Officer of the Year by the Montgomery County SWAT-Central Region Team which covers Plymouth Township. Officer David Phillips has been a member of the SWAT Team since 2006, serving with the Colonial Team until its merger with Montgomery County SWAT-Central Region in 2009. Officer David Phillips was initially selected as a tactical sniper until he took on a leadership position and was promoted to Sniper Element Leader in 2015. Officer David Phillips, through his hard work, dedication and ability was the recipient of the 2021 Lt. Joseph P. Rosko SWAT Officer of the Year Award. Now, therefore be it resolved that Officer David Phillips be commended for his hard work and dedication to the Montgomery County SWAT-Central Region Team; as well as to the citizens of Plymouth Township and Montgomery County. Ms. Viscio made a motion to approve this recognition and was seconded by Ms. Bramblett. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

Ms. Bandish made a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Whitney. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

APPROVAL OF DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS AND BILLS: Chairman Manero called for the approval of the departmental reports and bills.

Mr. Whitney made a motion to approve the departmental reports and bills. The motion was seconded by Ms. Bramblett. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

ADMINISTRATION

- a. Deputy Tax Collector Appointment Resolution- ACTION- Ms. Bramblett made a motion to approve this resolution authorizing Berkheimer as Deputy Tax Collector. The motion was seconded by Ms. Bandish. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.
- b. H.A. Berkheimer Agreement- Real Estate Tax Collection- ACTION-Mr. Clarke stated this agreement is between Plymouth Township and H.A. Berkheimer. The Township agrees to compensate and reimburse Berkheimer for all of their services. Ms. Bramblett made a motion to approve this agreement and was seconded by Ms. Viscio. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.
- c. Liquor Licenses Fee Resolution- ACTION- Ms. Bandish made a motion to approve this resolution and was seconded by Ms. Viscio. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.
