# August 14, 2023

Pledge of Allegiance - The Regular Meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. and Chairman Manero led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**PUBLIC COMMENT-** There was no public comment pertaining to any items advertised on the agenda.

Announcement- The Conditional Use Hearing for 502 W. Germantown Pike has been continued to September 11, 2023 at 6:00 p.m.

Citizen Commendation- Michael Leatherbury- Ms. Bandish read the commendation recognizing Michael Leatherbury for his heroic actions rescuing a twelve-year-old child, who was drowning in the pool at the Place One Apartments on July 3, 2023. Ms. Bandish made a motion to approve this commendation and was seconded by Mr. Whitney. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 4-0 with Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor. Ms. Bramblett was absent.

Swearing In- Michael McGuigan Deputy Fire Marshal- Mr. Manero presided over the swearing in of Michael McGuigan as Deputy Fire Marshal.

20 Years of Service Resolution- Christopher Schwartz- ACTION- Mr. Manero read the resolution recognizing Christopher Schwartz for his generous and outstanding service and contributions rendered while serving in the Police Department since July 14 2003, thereby completing 20 years of service. Council extends its appreciation to Christopher Schwartz who served with commitment and dedication. Mr. Manero made a motion to approve this resolution and was seconded by Mr. Whitney. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 4-0 with Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor. Ms. Bramblett was absent.

### MISCELLANEOUS/OLD BUSINESS

a. Citizen Board Vacancy Announcement- Mr. Whitney stated the following citizen board positions are open: three positions on the Property Maintenance Code Appeals Board, one on the Historical Architectural Review Board, and one on the Human Relations Commission. Anyone interested in serving on one of these boards can submit a resume or letter of interest to Karen Weiss, the Township Manager.

## AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Mr. Robert E. Blue, P.E. stated he is representing Mr. and Mrs. Miller regarding their property on Butler Pike. Mr. Blue stated resolution 2023-24, was recently approved to subdivide their lot into two. However, the waivers that were requested such as, widening of the road and putting in sidewalks and curbs, he is asking council to reconsider. Mr. Blue stated there are four major trees in the frontage that would have to be taken down; there are no curbs and sidewalks on their road, which would lead to nowhere if installed. In addition, Montgomery County owns Butler Pike, which was recently repaved. Mr. Blue stated they have provided for a right-of-way. Mr. Manero asked Mr. Clarke what would be needed to reconsider. Mr. Clarke stated Council would have to determine if they want to consider the request. If so, this item would need to be on a future agenda to modify the original resolution. Council agreed to think about this and get back to him.

Ms. Carol Betham stated on the last month's agenda an item was bypassed, the firefighters' rebate. Ms. Betham asked if the Township is going to go over this. Ms. Weiss stated yes, a few months ago it was on the agenda. The Emergency Services Board will meet this Thursday; Council asked them to come up with qualifications. If Council is in favor of this, Act 172 allows real estate rebates to active volunteers.
