Pledge of Allegiance - The Regular Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. and Chairman Manero led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT- There was no public comment pertaining to any items advertised on the agenda.

A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

Mr. Whitney made a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Ms. Bandish. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

APPROVAL OF DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS AND BILLS: Chairman Manero called for the approval of the departmental reports and bills.

Mr. Whitney made a motion to approve the departmental reports and bills. The motion was seconded by Ms. Bramblett. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.

ADMINISTRATION

- a. 2024 Budget Meetings- October 16th, October 23rd, and November 20th at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Manero announced the Budget Meeting dates as follows: Monday, October 16 at 6:00 p.m., Monday, October 23 at 6:00 p.m., and Monday, November 20 at 6:00 p.m.
- b. Regular Meeting Change of Date from Monday, October 9th to Tuesday, October 10th- Mr. Manero stated the date of the Plymouth Township Council Regular Meeting for October, previously advertised for Monday, October 9 at 7:00 p.m. has been changed to Tuesday, October 10 at 7:00 p.m.

- c. Pension Fund- Allocation of 2023 State Check- ACTION- Ms. Bandish reported that the Township received a check from the State in the amount of \$909,150.56 to help fund the Township Pension Plans. The allocation for 2023 is \$489,542.61 for the Police Pension Plan and \$419,607.95 for the Non-Uniformed Plan. Ms. Bandish made a motion to approve this and was seconded by Mr. Whitney. A roll call vote was taken and the motion passed 5-0 with Ms. Bramblett, Ms. Bandish, Ms. Viscio, Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Manero in favor.
- d. Pension Fund- Minimum Municipal Obligation for 2024 Announcement- Ms. Bramblett said the actuary has determined the Township shall contribute \$1,325,669 to the Police Pension Plan and \$463,183 to the Civilian Pension Plan. The actuary is also recommending that we budget revenue of \$792,609 for the anticipated State Pension Aid in 2024. The net pension cost to the Township for both pension plans in 2024 will therefore be \$996,243. This represents a decrease of \$142,646 from the 2023 contribution.
